

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR A VARIATION OF A PREMISES LICENCE

Notice is hereby given that We, **Greene King Retailing Ltd** has applied to **Maidstone Borough Council** on **1st September 2014** for a variation to a premises licence to use the premises at: **Druids Arms, 24 Earl Street, Maidstone, Kent, ME14 1PP.**

To vary the licensing plans to include the following works: **Ground floor:** Reforming the main entrance lobby off the High Street. Forming an enclosed wash-up area to the end of the bar. Demolishing the existing toilets & constructing new in the area to the rear of the existing toilets - currently storage. Existing toilets to become new trade area with fixed & loose seating. Forming a new external bar with a roller shutter to storage area. General redecoration, new carpet, refurbishment of existing timber flooring, & some new furniture & light fittings. **First floor:** Re-siting the trade kitchen into the room to the front of the building where the existing food hoist is sited. Blocking up 2 No openings & forming 2 No new openings to achieve fire escape corridor from the newly formed kitchen.
