

Kent County Council, acting in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, makes or intends to make the following Orders.

CANTERBURY AREA

A299 THANET WAY WHITSTABLE OFF-SLIP (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

To allow replacement of street-lighting columns and other highway maintenance works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit eastbound traffic on A299 Thanet Way Whitstable Off-slip (Thanet Way Slip Way).

An overnight closure is planned for Tuesday 16 February 2016 for up to 1 night, from 20:00 hours through until 05:00 hours.

The coastbound Whitstable Off-slip will be closed from A299 Thanet Way to the junction with Church Lane, with no direct access from Thanet Way to Whitstable during these works.

The alternative route is to continue eastbound on A299 Thanet Way to A291 junction at Herne Bay, then westbound on A2990 (Old) Thanet Way.

Westbound (London-bound) traffic from Whitstable is unaffected.

CHARTHAM LEVEL CROSSING, CHARTHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of level crossing maintenance and other associated works, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on Chartham Level Crossing, Chartham, Canterbury.

Overnight and weekend closures are now planned as follows

- Monday 15 February 2016 from 22:30 hours through until 06:00 hours
- Saturday 27 February 2016 from 01:00 hours continuing through until Monday 29 February at 04:00 hours *(please note the earlier start time, which now includes all day, Saturday)*

Station Road, Chartham will be closed in the vicinity of Chartham Level Crossing.

The alternative route is via A28 Ashford Road, Shalmsford Street, Bolts Hill, Parish Road, Church Lane and Station Road

Pedestrians will continue to be able to use the footbridge during closures, with arrangements on site for any pedestrians unable to do so.

Please note these details have been amended from what was previously advertised.

CHURCH LANE, CHARTHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of works to provide a new phone connection, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Church Lane, Chartham, Canterbury.

An off-peak closure is planned for Monday 29 February 2016 for up to 1 day, between 09:30 hours and approximately 15:30 hours.

Church Lane, Chartham will be closed between the junctions with Station Road and River Court, with no through access during works.

The alternative route is via Church Lane, The Green and Station Road.

CHURCH LANE & CHEQUERS HILL, PETHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of works to provide a new water connection, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Church Lane and Chequers Hill, Petham, Canterbury.

A closure is planned to commence from Monday 15 February 2016 for an estimated period of up to 5 days.

Church Lane / Chequers Hill will be closed from Petham Primary School as far as the entrance to Yew Tree Park, with no through access during works.

The alternative route is via B2068 Stone Street, Town Road, The Street and Church Lane.

Due to the nature of these works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

HOWFIELD LANE, CHARTHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of works to provide a new electricity supply, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Howfield Lane, Chartham, Canterbury.

A closure is planned to commence from Monday 15 February 2016 for an estimated period of up to 8 working days.

Howfield Lane will be closed in the vicinity of the railway bridge, with access from either direction up to where the road is closed, but no through access.

The alternative route is via A28 Ashford Road, Hatch Lane and Town Road.

Due to the nature of these works, it will not be possible to re-open the road during the first 5 days. It is aimed to re-open the road at the weekend, then any further closures will be daytime only.

KIRBY'S LANE, CANTERBURY (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of works to provide a new gas supply, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Kirby's Lane, Canterbury.

A closure is planned to commence from Monday 29 February 2016 for an estimated period of up to 3 days

Kirby's Lane will be closed in the vicinity of numbers 66-70, with no through access between St Dunstan's Street and Becket Mews.

The alternative route is via A290 St Dunstan's Street and Station Road West.

Due to the nature of these works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

ST STEPHEN'S LEVEL CROSSING, CANTERBURY (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of level crossing maintenance and other associated works, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on St Stephen's Level Crossing, Canterbury.

A closure is planned to commence from Sunday 21 February 2016 from 02:00 hours continuing through until 22 February at 04:30 hours

St Stephen's Road will be closed in the vicinity of the level crossing

The alternative route is via St Stephen's Road, Station Road West, St Dunstan's Street, Forty Acres Road, Beaconsfield Road, St Stephen's Hill and St Stephen's Green

The alternative pedestrian route is via St Stephen's Court, St Stephen's Path, Station Road West and St Stephen's Road, with on-site arrangements for anyone unable to use this.

WRAIK HILL, WHITSTABLE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of works to lay phone ducting in the carriageway, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Wraik Hill, Whitstable.

A closure is planned to commence from Monday 29 February 2016 for an estimated period of up to 2 weeks.

Wraik Hill will be closed to the south of the junction with Willow Road, with no through access during works.

The alternative route is via A290 Clapham Hill, Pean Hill and Fox's Cross Road.

Access remains from either direction up to where the road is closed, but there will be no through access during these works.

Due to the nature of these works, it is unlikely the road can be re-opened outside the working hours, but it will be re-opened at the weekend if safe to do so.

DOVER AREA

THE STREET, FROGHAM (NONINGTON) (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of works to replace a damaged telegraph pole, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of The Street, Frogham (Nonington), Dover.

Off-peak closures are planned to commence from Tuesday 1 March 2016 for up to 2 days, between 09:30 hours and 15:30 hours each day.

The Street, Frogham will be closed from the vicinity of Little Fredville eastwards for a distance of approximately 600 metres.

The alternative route is via The Street, Firs Road, Nethersole Road, Forstal Road, Snowdown Road, Sandwich Road and Nightingale Lane.

Access remains from either direction up to where the road is closed, but there will be no through access.

MAIDSTONE AREA

A20 ASHFORD ROAD, BROOMFIELD & KINGSWOOD (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of the replacement of parapets on M20, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on A20 Ashford Road, Broomfield & Kingswood, on or after 2 March 2016 for up to 4 nights between 21.00hrs and 05.00hrs or until the works have been completed.

There will be no access for through traffic between the junctions with Chegworth Road and Greenway Court Road.

The alternative route for non-motorway traffic is via A20 Ashford Road, B2163 Penfold Hill/Lower Street/Upper Street/Leeds Road, A274 Maidstone Road, Chartway Street, Lenham Road, Fairbourne Lane and A20 Ashford Road.

The alternative route for HGV/motorway traffic is via A20 Ashford Road, M20 junction 8 to junction 9 and A20 Ashford Road.

DAIRY LANE, MARDEN (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of carriageway works, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Dairy Lane, Marden, on or after 3 March 2016 for up to 3 days or until the works have been completed.

The whole length of the road will be closed.

There is no diversion, however access will be maintained.

DEAN STREET, EAST FARLEIGH (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of cabling for a new customer, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on Dean Street, East Farleigh, on or after 20 February 2016

for up to 2 days or until the works have been completed.

There will be no access for through traffic between the junctions with Workhouse Lane and Forge Lane.

The alternative route is via Forge Lane, The Green, B2010 Lower Road, B2163 Ewell Lane/Heath Road and Dean Street.

FOOTPATH BETWEEN SHELLEY ROAD & HACKNEY ROAD, MAIDSTONE (PROHIBITION OF PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of gas main replacement works, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting pedestrian traffic using the footpath between Shelley Road & Hackney Road, Maidstone, on or after 15 February 2016 for up to 2 weeks or until the works have been completed.

The alternative route is via Chamberlain Avenue and Hackney Road.

GORE COURT ROAD, OTHAM & PLAIN ROAD, MARDEN (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

SCHEDULE

Gore Court Road, Otham – A274 Sutton Road to White Horse Lane
17th February 2016 for up to 5 days
Alternative route via White Horse Lane, Honey Lane, New Road and A274 Sutton Road

Plain Road, Marden – B2079 Goudhurst Road to Albion Road

29th February 2016 for up to 5 days
Alternative route via Albion Road, B2079 High Street/Church Green/West End/Goudhurst Road

PILGRIMS WAY & THE STREET, DETLING (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of gas main replacement works, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on Pilgrims Way & The Street, Detling, on or after 15 February 2016 for up to 3 weeks or until the works have been completed.

SCHEDULE

Pilgrims Way, Detling – The Street to Queens Way
15th February 2016 for up to 3 weeks
Alternative route is via The Street, Princes Way and Queens Way

The Street, Detling – Princes Way to Pilgrims Way
7th March 2016 for up to 5 weeks

Alternative route is via Pilgrims Way, Queens Way and Princes Way

ST ANN'S GREEN LANE, MARDEN (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because it is necessary to install a street cabinet and ducting, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on St Ann's Green Lane, Marden, on or after 15 February 2016 for up to 10 working days or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed from B2079 Maidstone Road to Sharp's Cottage.

The alternative route is via B2079 Maistone Road and Battle Lane.

WHITE HORSE LANE, OTHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of ditch clearance, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on White Horse Lane, Otham, on or after 20 February 2016 for up to 1 day or until the works have been completed.

There will be no access for through traffic between the junctions with Honey Lane and Gore Court Road.

The alternative route is via Gore Court Road, A274 Sutton Road, New Road and Honey Lane.

SEVENOAKS AREA

BAYLEYS HILL, SEVENOAKS WEALD (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of the replacement of a damaged telegraph pole, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Bayleys Hill, Sevenoaks Weald, on or after 1 March 2016 for up to 1 day or until the works have been completed.

here will be no access for through traffic between the junctions with Wickhurst Road and Bozwell Green.

The alternative route is via Wickhurst Road, Long Barn Road, Bozwell Road and Bozwell Green

CARTER'S HILL, SEAL AND MILL LANE, SEAL & HILDENBOROUGH (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of BT cabling for new services, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Carter's Hill, Seal and Mill Lane, Seal & Hildenborough, on or after 1 March 2016 for up to 2 days or until the works have been completed.

SCHEDULE

Carter's Hill, Seal – Bank Lane to Mill Lane
1 March 2016 for up to 2 days

Alternative route is via Bank lane, B245 London Road, Mill Lane, Vines Lane, Riding Lane, Hildenborough Road and Underriver House Road

Mill Lane, Seal – Great Hollenden Farm to Glenn Cottage
1 March 2016 for up to 2 days

Alternative route is via Bank lane, B245 London Road, Mill Lane, Vines Lane, Riding Lane, Hildenborough Road and Underriver House Road

Mill Lane, Hildenborough – Glenn Cottage to Vines Lane
1 March 2016 for up to 2 days

Alternative route is via Bank lane, B245 London Road, Mill Lane, Vines Lane, Riding Lane, Hildenborough Road and Underriver House Road

CHURCH ROAD & GRANGE LANE, HARTLEY (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because it is necessary to replace electricity poles and wires, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on Church Road & Grange Lane, Hartley, on or after 15 February 2016 for up to 4 days or until the works have been completed.

SCHEDULE

Church Road, Hartley – between Grange Lane and Hartley Hill
15 February 2016 for up to 4 days
Alternative route is via St John's Lane, Ash Road and Church Road

Grange Lane, Hartley – whole length of the road
15 February 2016 for up to 2 days

Alternative route is via Hartley Bottom Road, Hartley Hill, Church Road, Ash Road and St John's Lane

WELLERS TOWN ROAD, CHIDDINGSTONE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of BT duct installation, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Wellers Town Road, Chiddingstone, on or after 29 February 2016 for up to 8 days or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed outside Chantler's Cottages.

The alternative route is via Ryewell Hill, Truggers Lane, Cowden Pound Road To Truggers Lane, Wilderness Lane, Lockskinners And The Village.

SHEPWAY AREA

ASHFORD ROAD, NEW ROMNEY (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of works to provide a new water connection, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Ashford Road, New Romney.

A closure is planned to start from Monday 15 February 2016 for an estimated period of up to 5 days.

Ashford Road will be closed in the vicinity of the junction with A259 High Street, with no through access during works.

The alternative route is via A259 High Street, Dymchurch Road, St Mary's Road and Fairfield Road.

The closure is in conjunction with temporary traffic lights on A259 High Street

Church Approach will be closed at the junction with A259 High Street, and can be accessed via A259 High Street, Lydd Road and Church Road.

The One-way Traffic Order in respect of Church Approach will be suspended from the point of closure, to allow access / exit.

Waiting will be prohibited at all times on both sides of Fairfield Road, to the extent indicated by No Waiting Signs and cones placed on site, to allow its use for the diversion.

This Order suspends any existing parking entitlements and restrictions that apply to the sections of road identified above.

Due to the nature of these works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (THE DISTRICT OF SHEPWAY) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING AND LOADING) (THE LEAS) EXPERIMENTAL ORDER 2016

Notice is hereby given that Kent County Council has made an experimental Order under Sections 9 and 10 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act:

When the Order comes into operation on the 15th February 2016, it will be on an experimental basis and be in force for a maximum period of 18 months.

The effect will be to create a length of 'no waiting and no loading at any time' restriction on the north side of The Leas from the north-east side of 30-32 Clifton Road in an easterly direction for 189 Metres.
