

Kent County Council, acting in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, makes or intends to make the following Orders.

Kent County Council will be considering in due course whether the provisions of the experimental order should be continued in force indefinitely. Any person may object to the making of this order for the purpose of such indefinite continuation within a period of six months-

(a) beginning with the day on which the experimental order came into force, or

(b) if the order is varied by another order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the 1984 Act, beginning with the day on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification came into force.

Any such objection must be in writing stating the grounds on which it is made and sent to Shepway District Council (Parking Services) Civic Centre, Castle Hill Avenue, Folkestone, CT20 2QY.

VARIOUS ROADS, (PROVISION OF ON-STREET DISABLED PERSON'S PARKING PLACES) CONSOLIDATION ORDER 2012 (AMENDMENT NO. 8)

Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL proposes the above Order under Sections 1, 2, 32 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act:

The Order proposes to install disabled persons parking places in the following streets: -

3 Connaught Road, Folkestone; 15 Bonsor Road, Folkestone; 29 Ivy Way, Folkestone; 72 Garden Road, Folkestone; 16 Ormonde Road, Folkestone; 31 Fernbank Crescent, Folkestone; 99 Shaftesbury Avenue, Cheriton, Folkestone; 117 Shaftesbury Avenue, Cheriton, Folkestone; 15 Clifton Crescent, Folkestone; Opposite 28 Taylors Lane, St Mary's Bay; Opposite 26 Taylors Lane, St Mary's Bay; 33 St Leonard's Road, Hythe.

This Order also proposes to revoke disabled persons' parking places from the following streets: -

1-3 Clifton Crescent, Folkestone; 24-26 Earls Avenue, Folkestone; 29 Branber Close, Folkestone; 5 Elmstead Place, Folkestone; 22 Brockman Road, Folkestone; 10 Brockman Rd, Folkestone; 9 Oaks Rd, Cheriton, Folkestone; 80 Roman Way, Cheriton, Folkestone; 197 Dover Road, Folkestone; 84 Guildhall Street North, Folkestone; 23 Moorhall Avenue, Cheriton, Folkestone.

SWALE AREA

CHURCH ROAD, TONGE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of works to install new ducts and cabling for a forthcoming solar farm, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Church Road, Tonge, Sittingbourne.

A closure is planned to start from Monday 15 February 2016 with estimated completion by 11 March 2016.

Church Road, Tonge will be closed in the vicinity of the junction with Lomas Road, with no through access.

There is no alternative route as the road is a cul-de-sac.

Managed access for residents and businesses will be maintained whenever it is safe to do so, with operatives on site to assist this. However, there are likely to be some delays and certain times when this is not possible for safety reasons, whilst works are being carried out.

SCHOOL LANE, IWADE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of works to construct a site entrance, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of School Lane, Iwade (Swale).

A closure is planned to commence from Monday 15 February 2016 for an estimated period of up to 1 week.

School Lane will be closed from the junction with Basser Hill north-eastwards to a point approximately 100 metres north-east of Orchard Farm, with no through access during works.

The alternative route is via Stickfast Lane, Sheppey Way, Ferry Road and School Lane.

Due to the nature of these works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

TUNSTALL ROAD, TUNSTALL (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of works to alter the gas service, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Tunstall Road, Tunstall, Sittingbourne.

A closure is planned to commence from Monday 15 February 2016 for an estimated period of up to 5 days.

Tunstall Road will be closed to the east of the sharp bend where the pond is (in the vicinity of properties

Ballochantuy to Verann), with no through access during these works.

The alternative route is via Tunstall Road, Hearts Delight Road, Hearts Delight, Bannister Hill, Borden Lane, A2 London Road, Park Road, Gore Court Road and Woodstock Road.

Access remains from either direction up to where the road is closed, but there will be no through access.

Due to the nature of these works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

TONBRIDGE & MALLING AREA

BOURNE LANE, TONBRIDGE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of a new connection to a water main, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on Bourne Lane, Tonbridge, on or after 15 February 2016 for up to 5 days or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed at the junction with Bourne Close.

COACH ROAD, IGHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of drainage works, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Coach Road, Igtham, on or after 29 February 2016 for up to 5 days or until the works have been completed.

The whole length of the road will be closed.

The alternative route is via A25 Sevenoaks Road/Igtham By-Pass, A227 Borough Green Road/The Street/Igtham Road and High Cross Road.

LAMBERTS YARD, NEW WHARF ROAD, BRADFORD STREET & RIVER WALK, TONBRIDGE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING, SUSPENSION OF ONE-WAY ORDERS & PROHIBITION OF RIGHT TURN) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of footway kerbing, repaving & carriageway resurfacing, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Lamberts Yard on or after 29 February 2016 for up to 1 week and New Wharf Road for up to 2 weeks or until the works have been completed. The One-Way Orders on Bradford Street and River Walk will be suspended to allow for the diversion route. Traffic turning right from Bradford Street into B2260 High Street will also be prohibited.

The whole of Lamberts Road will be closed. New Wharf Road will be closed from B2260 High Street to outside number 4 and the alternative route is via B2260 High Street, Bradford Street and River Walk.

PILGRIMS WAY, WROTHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2016

Because of overhead power line maintenance and renewal, Kent County Council has made an Order

prohibiting through traffic on Pilgrims Way, Wrotham, on or after 15 February 2016 for up to 4 days or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed outside number 1 Blacksole Cottages.

The alternative route is via Battlefields, Kemsing Road, High Street and Old London Road.

TUNBRIDGE WELLS AREA

(VARIOUS ROADS, THE BOROUGH OF TUNBRIDGE WELLS) (20MPH, 30MPH, 40MPH, 50MPH SPEED LIMITS AND DERESTRICTED ROADS) Amendment No.11 ORDER 2016 ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL, acting as local traffic authority and in exercise of its powers under Sections 81, 82, 83 and 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1984) as amended, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act of 1984, proposes to make the following Order.

Lady Oak Lane, Goudhurst

1. To implement a 30mph speed limit from the junction with the A21 (London Road) to a point 775 metres north of this junction.

2. To implement a 40mph speed limit from its junction with Rogers Rough Road to a point 775 metres north of its junction with (A21) London Road.

Bedgebury Road, Goudhurst

To implement a 40mph speed limit from a point 250 metres south of its junction with Balcomb's Hill to its junction with Rogers Rough Lane.
