THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (PUBLIC FOOTPATH AE5 (PART) CHILHAM) PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2016

The above-named Order, made on 6th May 2016 under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, will divert the entire width of that length of Public Footpath numbered AE5 which commences 6 metres inside the field boundary from its junction with Stone Stile Road and runs in an east-south-easterly direction for 209 metres to a point which lies 5 metres inside the field boundary from its junction with New Cut Road. The Order will add a new length of Public Footpath to be numbered AE5, with a width of 2.5 metres which commences at TR 0602 5538 and runs along the inside field boundary in a north-easterly direction for 148 metres to TR 0616 5548 continuing in a south-south-easterly direction for approximately 160 metres to TR 0622 5533. All directions general, all distances approximate.

Copies of any objections or representations received may be disclosed to interested parties, including the Planning Inspectorate where the case is referred to it for determination.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Kent County Council may confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order.

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 sections 16A – C as inserted by the Road Traffic Regulation (Special Events) Act 1994 section 1.

Kent County Council intends to temporarily close Public Footpath AT40 between public footpath WC353 and public bridleway AT55 from 10:00 hours on Sunday 29th May and 18:00 hours on Monday 30th May 2016.

The paths will be closed to facilitate the holding of the Hole Park Napoleonic Re-enactment event 2016.

A safe and convenient alternative route is available. The alternative route that can be used by pedestrians is along the farm track to the north of AT40.

IN THE CITY OF CANTERBURY NOTICE OF MAKING OF RAIL CROSSING DIVERSION ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTION 119A THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (PUBLIC FOOTPATH CB92 (PART) WESTBERE) RAIL CROSSING DIVERSION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2016

The above named Order was made on 13th May 2016 under section 119A of the Highways Act 1980 (as amended by the Transport and Works Act 1992). The Order will divert the full width of that part of public footpath numbered CB92 which commences on Walnut Tree Lane at NGR TR 1964 6101 (point A) and runs south over the railway crossing for 16.5 metres to NGR TR 1965 6100 (point B). Between the points A-B on the Order plan. It will add a new length of public footpath numbered CB92 which commences at the aforementioned point A and runs north-east for 263.0 metres to NGR TR 1988 6113 (point C), thence turns to run south-south-east over the new railway crossing for 16.0 metres, and thence turns to run south-west for 266.0 metres to the aforementioned point B. Between points A-C-D-B on the Order plan.

Heading north-east from point A, the path has an initial width of 1.2 metres, widening to 1.5 metres after 7.0 metres until approximately 60.0 metres before point C where it widens to 1.8 metres. The path narrows to 1.15 metres across the railway lines (points C-D). Heading south-west from point D, the path has an initial width of 1.3 metres widening to 1.5 metres after the gate. For approximately 10.0 metres where it runs

alongside the electrical hut the path narrows to 1.2 metres, widening to 1.75 metres after that. For the last 16.0 metres where there are hand rails leading to the gate, the path narrows to 1.3 metres.

All directions general, all distances approximate.

IN THE DISTRICT OF DOVER ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (PUBLIC FOOTPATH ER10 (PART) IN THE PARISH OF RINGWOULD WITH KINGSDOWN) (PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC) ORDER 2016

Notice is hereby given that The Kent County Council in exercise of all its powers under Section 1 (a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 is proposing to make an Order the effect of which will be to permanently prohibit access of all traffic over the entire width of that length of Public Footpath ER10 which commences from NGR TR 3807 4719 (Point A), approximately 628 metres south of its junction with Undercliffe Road and runs in a generally southerly direction for a distance of approximately 660 metres to NGR TR 3796 4654 (Point B) at its termination point on the beach, as indicated on plan attached to the Order.
