

**THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, BOROUGH OF SWALE)
(WAITING RESTRICTIONS AND STREET PARKING PLACES)
(AMENDMENT No.9) ORDER 2017**

Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL intend to make the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act:

The Order will Amend the Kent County Council (Various Roads, Borough of Swale) (Waiting Restrictions and Street Parking Places) (Consolidation) Order 2016 by

- (a) installing double yellow lines on the junction of Linkway and School Lane, and the junction of Linkway and Spingvale in Iwade;
- (b) installing new, or formalising existing disabled persons' parking bays outside of 7 Fonblanque Road, Sheerness and 63 Holmside Avenue in Minster;
- (d) removing existing disabled persons' parking bays opposite 82 Kingsnorth Road, Faversham and outside 51 Invicta Road in Sheerness.

Full details are contained in the draft Order which, together with a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, a map and a copy of any Orders which will be amended by the proposed Order may be examined at the Borough Council Offices, Swale House, East Street, Sittingbourne, Kent, ME10 3HT, the Alexander Centre, 15 Preston Street, Faversham ME13 8NS or Sheerness Gateway Offices, 38-42 High Street, Sheerness, ME12 1NL during normal office hours.
