

Kent County Council, acting in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, makes or intends to make the following Orders.

The southern section of Cheriton Place will be closed between the 2 junctions with Pleydell Gardens. Access to Longford Way continues from the Sandgate Road direction.

The alternate routes for any through traffic are southbound via Sandgate Road, West Terrace and The Leas, and northbound via The Leas, Shakespeare Terrace and Sandgate Road

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

STAPLE LANE, POSTLING (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow safe access to underground structures for cabling works to be carried out to provide a new phone service, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Staple Lane, Postling, near Folkestone.

Off-peak closures are planned from Monday 16 October 2017 for up to 2 days, between 09:30 hours and approximately 15:30 hours each day.

Staple Lane will be closed in the vicinity of the junction with The Street / Pilgrims Way.

The alternative route is via The Street, Cuckoo Street and Sandling Road

Access to the remainder of Staple Lane continues an eastern direction up to where the road is actually closed, but there will be no through access during these works.

THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (THE DISTRICT OF SHEPWAY) (SANDGATE EAST PARKING ZONE) (AMENDMENT 1) ORDER 2017

Notice is hereby given that KENT COUNTY COUNCIL intend to make the above Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) to (3), 3(2), 4(1) and (2), 32(1), 35(1), 45, 46, 49 and 53 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act:

The Order will extend the Sandgate East Parking Zone (Zone S) to include other roads in Sandgate listed below:

- Wilberforce Road

The Order proposes the following:

Permit holders only [between 11:00 – 15:00 hours Mondays-Fridays]

- Bybrook Field
- Bybrook Way
- The Crescent
- The Undercliff (not including the private section)
- Wilberforce Road

Permit holders and time limited waiting [between 08:00 – 18:00 hours on all days]

Parking places with a time limit of 2 hours (no return within two hours) - except for Permit Holders - will be provided in the following roads.

- Sandgate High Street
- Gough Road
- The Riviera (not including the private section)
- Radnor Cliff
- Radnor Cliff Crescent
- Sandgate Hill (between Sandgate High Street and Coolinge Lane)
- Military Road (between Sandgate High Street and Bybrook Way)

Permits will be available to all residents living within the zone and to any business or organisation with vehicle(s) essential to its operation.

An annual resident permit will cost £30; and Resident Visitors Permits will cost £5.20 for 5 parking sessions. A Business Permit will cost £60 per annum.

Waiting will be prohibited in any part of the roads mentioned in the second paragraph of this Notice and in sections of roads detailed in the draft Order where parking is not allowed.

Full details are contained in the draft Order, which together with the relevant drawings, a copy of any orders which will be amended by the proposed Order, and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined at The Council Offices, Castle Hill Avenue, Folkestone.

SWALE AREA

BELL ROAD, BRENCHLEY ROAD & CAPEL ROAD, SITTINGBOURNE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow gas mains replacement works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic at the junction between Bell Road, Brenchley Road and Capel Road, Sittingbourne.

Bell Road, Brenchley Road and Capel Road will be closed at the junction where they meet each other.

The closure is planned from Friday 20 October 2017 with estimated completion by 30 October 2017.

The alternative routes are as follows

- BELL ROAD – via Avenue of Remembrance, Park Road and Gore Court Road
- BRENCHLEY ROAD – via Swanstree Avenue, Highsted Road and Bell Road to then join the Bell Road diversion
- CAPEL ROAD – via Bell Road, Gore Court Road and Whitehall Road

Access to the remainder of each of the roads continues up to where the roads are closed at the junction.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the junction outside the working hours.

STAPLESTREET ROAD, BOUGHTON UNDER BLEAN (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow carriageway repairs and kerbing works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Staplestreet Road, Boughton under Blean, near Faversham.

A closure is planned from Monday 16 October 2017 for an estimated period of up to 5 days.

Staplestreet Road will be closed in the general vicinity of Orchard Bungalow, with no through access between the junctions with The Street and Dawes Road.

Access to the remainder of Staplestreet Road continues from a northern direction up to where the road is actually closed, but there will be no through access during these works.

The alternative route to reach Staplestreet Road is via The Street, Bull Lane, Butts Hill and Staple Street.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

TONBRIDGE & MALLING AREA

LONG MILL LANE, PLATT (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

Because a new gas service is to be installed, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Long Mill Lane, Platt, on or after 30 October 2017 for up to 7 working days or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed outside “Tudor Barn”.

The alternative route for northbound traffic is via Potash Lane and Comp Lane and southbound traffic is via Comp Lane and Beechin Wood Lane.

MILL HALL, AYLESFORD (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

Because of works to the level crossing, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on Mill Hall, Aylesford, on or after 14 October 2017 from 23.30hrs to 04.00hrs on 16 October 2017 or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed at the level crossing.

There is no alternative route but a marshal will be provided for the safe crossing of pedestrians.

PILGRIMS WAY & HIGH STREET, AYLESFORD (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING & SUSPEND 7.5T ENVIRONMENTAL WEIGHT LIMIT) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

Because of the installation of signs and carriageway markings, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Pilgrims Way, Aylesford, on or after 4 November 2017 from 07.00hrs to 17.00hrs on 5 November 2017 and on or after 11 November 2017 from 07.00hrs to 05.00hrs on 13 November 2017 or until the works have been completed.

The whole length of the road will be closed. The 7.5T environmental weight restriction on High Street will be suspended during the works to allow for the diversion.

The alternative route is via Bull Lane, High Street, Rochester Road and vice versa.

(VARIOUS ROADS, THE BOROUGH OF TONBRIDGE AND MALLING) (20MPH, 30MPH, 40MPH, 50MPH SPEED LIMITS AND DERESTRICTED ROADS) AMENDMENT No.28 ORDER 2017

- WHITEHOUSE CRESCENT** – From its junction with Rochester Road for its entire length
