

Highways

Kent County Council, acting in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, makes or intends to make the following Orders.

ASHFORD AREA

(BETHERSDEN ROAD, BOROUGH OF ASHFORD) (WIDTH RESTRICTION) ORDER 2017

The Kent County Council in exercise of the powers under Sections 1(1), 2(1), (2), (3), 4(2) and Part IV on Schedule 9) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (the Act of 1984), as amended, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby makes the above named Order:-

The general effect of this Order is to prevent any vehicle with a maximum permissible laden weight of which exceeds 6'-6" (2 metres) to proceed in those lengths of road specified in the Schedule of the Order. Exemptions are provided in the Order for; access to land & properties, permit holders, vehicles engaged in agricultural activities, emergency services, authorities in pursuance of statutory powers and vehicles engaged in such building operations as maintenance, improvement or demolition. Full details and exemptions are provided in the articles of the Order.

Roads subject to a 6'- 6" (2 metres) Width Restriction stated below

BETHERSDEN ROAD, (HOTHFIELD); from its junction with Pluckley Road (Hothfield) south-westwards to its junction with Bethersden Road (Bethersden)

BETHERSDEN ROAD, (BETHERSDEN); from its junction with Bethersden Road (Hothfield) south-westwards via Fridd Corner to its crossroads junction with Old Surrenden Manor Road and Pluckley Road

CHILHAM LEVEL CROSSING, MYSTOLE LANE, CHILHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER NOVEMBER 2017

To allow level crossing maintenance and other associated works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on Chilham Level Crossing, Mystole Lane, Chilham, near Ashford.

A closure is planned for Sunday 26 November 2017 from 01:00 hours continuing through until 27 November at 06:00 hours.

Mystole Lane will be closed in the vicinity of Chilham Level Crossing. Mystole Lane is shown as Pickelden Lane on some maps.

The alternative route is via A28 Canterbury Road, Shalmsford Street, Chartham Downs Road, Mystole Lane and Pickelden Lane.

Access remains from either direction up to where the road is closed, but there will be no through access.

CHURCH STREET, WYE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow the safe use of a mobile crane to install a glass apex roof, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Church Street, Wye, near Ashford.

A closure is planned for Tuesday 19 December 2017, between 08:00 hours and 18:00 hours.

If the weather is unsuitable to allow the use of a mobile crane that day, the works will be deferred until the following Monday, 27 November 2017.

Church Street will be closed in the vicinity of number 15, with access from either direction up to where the road is closed, but no through access.

The alternative route is via Bridge Street, Upper Bridge Street and High Street.

WYE LEVEL CROSSING, WYE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER NOVEMBER 2017

To allow level crossing maintenance and other associated works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on Wye Level Crossing, Wye near Ashford.

Closures are planned as follows

- Sunday 26 November 2017 between 01:00 hours and 18:00 hours

Bridge Street will be closed in the vicinity of the Level Crossing.

~ There will be no direct access between the A28 and Wye during these works ~

The alternative route is via Harville Road, A28 Canterbury Road, A2070 Willesborough Road, Kennington Road, The Street (Willesborough), Hinxhill Road, Naccolt

Road, Oxenturn Road, Upper Bridge Street, High Street, Churchfield Way and Bridge Street.

On site arrangements will be in place for any pedestrians unable to use the footbridge.

VARIOUS ROADS, HIGH HALDEN (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow cable ducting works to be carried out in connection with the installation of broadband, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on various roads in High Halden, near Tenterden.

Closures are planned from 4 December 2017 onwards, in the sequence shown below, with only one road will be closed at any one time.

The timing of the phases is approximate and may potentially be affected by weather and ground conditions. Any changes will be notified to local residents and signposted on site.

SHAWLANDS LANE closed from 4 December 2017 for approximately 3 weekdays

The closure is from the junction with Thurstons Lane southwards for approximately 420 metres

The alternate route is via Thurstons Lane and Wren's Nest Lane

THURSTONS LANE will then be closed for approximately 2 weekdays

The closure is from the junction with Shawlands Lane westwards to the property Summerlease Cottage

The alternative route is via Shawlands Lane and Wren's Nest Lane

HARRIS LANE will then be closed for approximately 1 weekday

The closure is from the junction with Thurstons Lane northwards to the property Little Acorn Farm

The alternate route is via Thurstons Lane and High Halden Road

Due to the nature of these works, it may not be possible to re-open the roads outside the working hours.

Access for residents affected will be maintained whenever it is safe to do so, but there are likely to be delays and certain times when this is not possible for safety reasons.

CANTERBURY AREA

BIGBURY ROAD, CHARTHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow safe access to the overhead phone cable network to enable works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Bigbury Road, Chartham, near Canterbury.

Off-peak closures are planned from Tuesday 21 November 2017 for up to 2 days, between 09:30 hours and approximately 15:30 hours each day.

Bigbury Road will be closed in the general vicinity of Howfield Wood, with access from either direction up to where the road is closed at any time, but no through access.

The alternative route is via Bigbury Road, Tonford Lane, Faulknors Lane, Chartham Hatch Lane, A2050 Harbledown Bypass, A290 Rheims Way, A28 Wincheap Green, Wincheap, Thanington Road, Ashford Road and Howfield Lane.

CHALKPIT LANE, STAPLE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow works to be carried out to repair damaged telegraph poles, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Chalkpit Lane, Staple, in the Dover area.

An off-peak is planned for Monday 4 December 2017, between 09:30 hours and approximately 15:30 hours.

Chalkpit Lane, Staple will be closed between both junctions with Barnsole Road.

The alternative route is via Barnsole Road, Fleming Road, Drainless Road, Hammill Road and Sandwich Road.

Access to Chalkpit Lane, Woodnesborough continues from an eastern direction up to where the road is actually closed.

COCKERING ROAD, THANINGTON (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow works to be carried out to remove trees prior to construction works, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Cockerling Road, Thanington, near Canterbury.

Off-peak closures are planned from Monday 4 December 2017 for up to 5 days, between 10:00 hours and approximately 15:00 hours each day.

Cockerling Road will be closed from junction with Strangers Lane to the vicinity of number 39, with access from either direction up to where the road is closed, but no through access.

The alternative route is via Strangers Lane, A28 Thanington Road and St Nicholas Road.

PARK LANE, BISHOPSBOURNE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow works to be carried out to provide a new gas supply, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Park Lane, Bishopsbourne, near Canterbury.

A closure is planned from Monday 4 December 2017 for

an estimated period of up to 3 days.

Park Lane will be closed in the vicinity of Cedar Grove.

There is no alternative route as the road is a cul-de-sac.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

Access for any residents affected will be maintained whenever it is safe to do so, but there are likely to be delays and certain times when this is not possible for safety reasons.

RICHDORE ROAD, WALTHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow works to be carried out to lay phone ducting in the carriageway, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Richdore Road, Waltham, near Canterbury.

A closure is planned from Wednesday 6 December 2017 with estimated completion by 8 December.

Richdore Road will be closed to the south of the junction with Anvil Green Road.

The alternative route is via Anvil Green Road, Kake Street and Woods Hill.

Access to the remainder of Richdore Road continues from a southern direction up to where the road is actually closed, but there will be no through access during these works.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

STOUR STREET, CANTERBURY (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow works to be carried out to lay phone ducting in the carriageway, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Stour Street, Canterbury.

Overnight closures are planned from Monday 20 November 2017 for up to 3 nights, between 19:00 hours through until approximately 05:00 hours each night.

Stour Street will be closed in the vicinity of Canterbury Heritage Museum, with no through access between the junctions with Hawks Lane and Jewry Lane.

The alternative route is via Beer Cart Lane, Watling Street, Rose Lane, Parade and High Street

Access to the remainder of Stour Street continues from either direction up to where the road is actually closed.

DARTFORD AREA

CHARLES STREET, STONE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

Because a new bridge is to be placed over the railway by a crane, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Charles Street, Stone, on the dates below or until the works have been completed.

2 December 2017 - from 21.00hrs to 09.00hrs
9 December 2017 from 21.00hrs to 09.00hrs on 11 December 2017

16 December 2017 - from 21.00hrs to 09.00hrs
24 December 2017 from 21.00hrs to 09.00hrs on 27 December 2017

The road will be closed at Stone Crossing Station.

The alternative route is via Charles Street, across railway crossing, Church Hill, Stone Place Road, A226 London Road, A206 St Clements Way, A206 Crossway Boulevard and vice versa.

POWDER MILL LANE, WILMINGTON (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

Because of repairs to the bridge deck and carriageway surfacing, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Powder Mill Lane, Wilmington, on or after 4 December 2017 for up to 1 week between 19.00hrs and 05.00hrs or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed at the bridge over River Darent.

The alternative route is via Darenth Road, A225 Princes Road, A225 Lowerfield Street, Warwick Way and vice versa.

DOVER AREA

GORE LANE, EASTRY (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow works to be carried out to provide a new electricity supply, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Gore Lane, Eastry, near Sandwich.

A closure is planned from Monday 4 December 2017 with estimated completion by 8 December 2017.

Gore Lane will be closed in the vicinity of Cressners, with no through access between the junctions with Centenary Gardens and Gore Road.

The alternative route is via Mill Lane, High Street and Gore Road.

Access to the remainder of Gore Lane continues from either direction up to where the road is actually closed, but there will be no through access during these works.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to

re-open the road outside the working hours.

SINGLEEDGE LANE, WHITFIELD (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow works to be carried out to repair a damaged sewer, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Singledge Lane, Whitfield, near Dover.

A closure is planned from Monday 4 December 2017, with estimated completion by 15 December.

Singledge Lane will be closed in the vicinity of number 56. Access to the remainder of Singledge Lane continues from either direction up to where the road is actually closed.

The alternative route is via A2 Dover Road, Sandwich Road, Bewsbury Cross Lane, and Nursery Lane

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

ST JAMES STREET, DOVER (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

To allow junction modifications and improvements to be carried out in connection with the St James development, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of St James Street, Dover.

A closure is planned from Monday 20 November 2017 for an estimated period of up to 5 weeks.

St James Street will be closed at its northern junction with Woolcomber Street.

The alternative route is via Castle Hill Road and Maison Dieu Road.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

MAIDSTONE AREA

B2079 GOUDHURST ROAD, MARDEN (40MPH SPEED LIMIT) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

For the safety of the public and workforce during the installation of a new drinking water main, Kent County Council has made an Order for a temporary mandatory speed limit of 40 miles per hour to be imposed on B2079 Goudhurst Road, Marden, on or after 20 November 2017 for up to 91 working days or until the works have been completed.

The restriction will be in place from outside 8 Brooklyn Villas to 2 Orchard Side.

BUCKLAND ROAD, MAIDSTONE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

Because of a new connection to the water main, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Buckland Road, Maidstone, on or after 4 December 2017 for up to 5 days or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed outside number 10.

The alternative route is via St Peter's Street, Buckland Hill and vice versa.

CHART ROAD, CHART SUTTON (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

Because of the installation of a BT cabinet, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on Chart Road, Chart Sutton, on or after 20 November 2017 for up to 12 days or until the works have been completed. The road will be closed outside "Laurel House".

The alternative route is via A274 North Street, Warmlake Road, Church Road and vice versa.

CHURCH STREET, MAIDSTONE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

Because of repairs to the carriageway and high friction surfacing, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on Church Street, Maidstone, on or after 20 November 2017 for up to 3 nights between 20.00hrs and 05.00hrs or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed from outside number 40 to the junction of King Street.

The alternative route is via Marsham Street, Queen Anne Avenue, Union Street, A249 Sittingbourne Road, A249 Albion Place, A249 Andrew Broughton Way, A249 Ashford Road, King Street and vice versa.

EYHORNE STREET, HOLLINGBOURNE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2017

Because of the replacement of a manhole frame and cover, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on Eyhorne Street, Hollingbourne, on or after 23 November 2017 for up to 1 night between 19.00hrs and 06.00hrs or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed outside "Godfrey House".

The alternative route is via A20 Ashford Road, New Cut Road, Bearsted Road, A249 Newnham Court
