

Highways

Kent County Council, acting in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, makes or intends to make the following Orders.

Notice was published, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

This Notice is published by Shepway District Council on behalf of Kent County Council Highways and Transportation, County Hall, Maidstone, ME14 (part of Kent County Council).

SWALE AREA

HOLYWELL LANE, UPCHURCH (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2018

To allow works to be carried out to lay a new gas main, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Holywell Lane, Upchurch, near Sittingbourne.

A closure is planned from Monday 5 February 2018 for an estimated period of up to 3 weeks.

Holywell Lane will be closed between the bridle-path south of Holywell Farm to vicinity of Bedfont House, with access from either direction up to where the road is closed, but no through access.

The alternative route is via Breach Lane, The Street and Halstow Lane.

Due to the nature of the works, the road will need to remain closed outside the working hours.

This Order comes into force from 5 February 2018 and remains in force until the works have been completed, with a maximum duration of 6 months.

NOUDS LANE, TEYNHAM (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2018

To allow safe access to the overhead cable network for phone cabling works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Nouds Lane, Teynham, near Sittingbourne

Off-peak closures are planned from Monday 22 January 2018 for up to 3 days, between 09:30 hours and approximately 15:30 hours each day Nouds Lane will be closed from the junction with A2 London Road to the vicinity of Nouds House.

The alternative route is via A2 London Road, Norton Lane, Norton Road and Tickham Lane back to Nouds Lane.

This Order comes into force from 22 January 2018 and remains in force until the works have been completed, with a maximum duration of 6 months.

TUNSTALL ROAD, TUNSTALL (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2018

To allow gas mains replacement works to be carried out, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Tunstall Road, Tunstall, near Sittingbourne.

Phased closures are planned from Monday 5 February 2018, with estimated completion by 12 March 2018.

Tunstall Road will be closed in sections working eastwards from the junction with Hearts Delight Road to the vicinity of the church.

The alternative routes are via Hearts Delight Road, Borden Road, Homewood Avenue, Ufton Road, Gore Court Road and Woodstock Road, or via Wrens Road, Gore Road and Primrose Road.

Access to the remainder of Tunstall Road continues from an eastern direction up to where the road is actually closed.

Due to the nature of these works, the road will need to remain closed outside the working hours.

This Order comes into force from 5 February 2018 and remains in force until the works have been completed, with a maximum duration of 6 months.

Further closures of Tunstall Road are planned for the school holidays at Easter and in the summer, to be notified nearer the time.

TONBRIDGE & MALLING AREA

DARK HILL ROAD, BOROUGH GREEN (PROHIBITION OF WESTBOUND TRAFFIC) TEMPORARY ORDER 2018

Because of vegetation clearance, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting westbound traffic on Dark Hill Road, Borough Green, on or after 8 February 2018 for up to 1 day or until the works have been completed.

The alternative route is via Quarry Hill Road, A25 Sevenoaks Road/ Borough Green Road.

TUNBRIDGE WELLS AREA

CALVERLEY ROAD, TUNBRIDGE WELLS (PROHIBITION OF EASTBOUND TRAFFIC) TEMPORARY ORDER 2018

Because of sewer repairs, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting eastbound traffic on Calverley Road, Tunbridge Wells between A264 Crescent Road and Camden Road on or after 10

February 2018 for up to 5 days or until the works have been completed. The alternative route is via Monson Road, A26 Mount Pleasant Road and A264 Crescent Road.

CULVERDEN PARK ROAD, TUNBRIDGE WELLS (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2018

Because of the replacement of a telegraph pole, Kent County Council intends to make an Order prohibiting through traffic on Culverden Park Road, Tunbridge Wells, on or after 5 February 2018 for up to 1 day or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed outside number 8.

The alternative route is via Culverden Park, Culverden Down and vice versa.

HANOVER ROAD, TUNBRIDGE WELLS (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2018

Because of remedial works on a sunken patch, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on Hanover Road, Tunbridge Wells, on or after 23 January 2018 for up to 3 days or until the works have been completed.

The road will be closed at the junction with Grosvenor Road.

The alternative route is via Grosvenor Road, A26 Mount Ephraim/ London Road, Mount Ephraim Road and Hanover Road.

KINGSWOOD ROAD & A264 PEMBURY ROAD (CYCLE LANE), TUNBRIDGE WELLS (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING & CYCLE LANE SUSPENSION) TEMPORARY ORDER 2018

Because of water mains replacement, Kent County Council has made an Order prohibiting through traffic on Kingswood Road and the cycle lane will be suspended on the footway of A264 Pembury Road, Tunbridge Wells, as per the schedule below or until the works have been completed.

SCHEDULE

Kingswood Road – A264 Pembury Road to Bayhall Road

22 January 2018 for up to 69 working days

The alternative route is via A264 Pembury Road, Bayhall Road and vice versa

A264 Pembury Road Cycle Lane – Calverley Park Gardens to Shandon Close

22 January 2018 for up to 75 working days

(VARIOUS ROADS, THE BOROUGH OF TUNBRIDGE WELLS) (20MPH, 30MPH, 40MPH, 50MPH SPEED LIMITS AND DEREGULATED ROADS) AMENDMENT No.18 ORDER 2017

NOTICE is hereby given that the Kent County Council proposes to make the above named Order under Sections 1, 2, 4 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which would be to:-

Due to the construction of a residential development Hastings Road, Hawkhurst, it has become necessary to extend/reduce the lengths and implement various speed limits in the following roads;

1. HASTINGS ROAD; From a point 24 metres south of Stream Lane southern junction to a point 564 metres South of Stream Lane southern junction
