

Highways

Kent County Council, acting in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, makes or intends to make the following Orders.

THANET AREA

A256 HAINE ROAD, RAMSGATE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

To allow essential carriageway resurfacing works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of A256 Haine Road, Ramsgate.

Weekday overnight closures are planned from Tuesday 19 October 2021 for up to 11 weekday nights, from 19:00 hours through until approximately 05:00 hours each night.

A256 Haine Road will be closed between Lord of the Manor Interchange and the junction with Spratling Street, to the actual extent shown on site.

The alternative route for through traffic is via A299 / A255 Canterbury Road East, A255 Nethercourt Circus, Nethercourt Hill, High Street St Lawrence, Park Road, Shah Place, A254 Margate Road, Pearce Signs Roundabout, A256 Haine Road and New Haine Road back to Haine Road.

Personnel will be on site to allow managed access for residents and businesses when it is safe to do so, but there are likely to be delays and certain times when this is not possible for safety reasons.

CALLIS COURT ROAD, BROADSTAIRS (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

To allow drainage repairs and improvements to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Callis Court Road, Broadstairs, in the Thanet area.

A closure is currently planned from Monday 18 October 2021, with estimated completion by 22 October 2022.

Callis Court Road will be closed between the junction with Northcliffe Gardens and entrance to Maurice House, to the actual extent shown on site.

The alternative route for through traffic is via Lanthorne Road, B2052 North Foreland Road, North Foreland Hill and Elmwood Avenue.

Local access to the remainder of Callis Court Road continues from either direction up to where the road is actually closed.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

CONVENT ROAD & GEORGE HILL ROAD, BROADSTAIRS (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

To allow telecoms ducting and cabling works to be carried out, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on sections of Convent Road and George Hill Road, Broadstairs.

A closure is currently planned from Tuesday 2 November 2021, with estimated completion by 4 November 2021.

Convent Road and George Hill Road will be closed at the junction where they meet each other, to the actual extent shown.

The overall alternative route for through traffic is via Convent Road, Reading Street Road, B2052 George Hill Road, Whiteness Road and Kingsgate Bay Road, and vice versa.

Local access to the remainder of Convent Road and George Hill Road continues up to the point of closure.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

HIGH STREET, RAMSGATE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER OCTOBER 2021

To allow works to be carried out to provide new electricity and water supplies, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of High Street, Ramsgate.

A closure is currently planned from Monday 18 October 2021, with estimated completion by 22 October 2021.

High Street will be closed between the junctions with Turner Street and Hardres Street, to the actual extent shown on site.

The alternative route for through traffic is via King Street, Broad Street, Hardres Street, A255 Boundary Road, Chatham Place and Chatham Street back to High Street.

The One-way Traffic Order in respect of High Street will be suspended between the junctions with Turner Street and Hardres Street, to allow limited essential access / exit up to where the road is closed.

Due to the nature of the works, the restrictions will need to remain in force at all times.

INGOLDSBY ROAD, BIRCHINGTON (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

To allow works to be carried out to provide new electricity supply, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Ingoldsby Road, Birchington, in the Thanet area.

A closure is currently planned from Wednesday 20 October 2021, with estimated completion by 29 October 2021.

Ingoldsby Road will be closed near the junction with Old Farm Road, to the actual extent shown on site.

The alternative route for any through traffic is via Minnis Road, Dane Road and Canute Road.

Local access to the remainder of Ingoldsby Road continues up to

where the road is actually closed.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

QUEEN STREET, RAMSGATE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

To allow safe underground access so that fibre cabling works can be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Queen Street, Ramsgate.

An overnight closure is planned for Tuesday 19 October 2021 from 19:00 hours through until approximately 05:00 hours.

Queen Street will be closed between the junctions with York Street and Leopold Street, to the actual extent shown on site.

The alternative route for through traffic is via Madeira Walk, Wellington Crescent, Victoria Parade, Victoria Road and King Street.

The One-way Traffic Order in respect of Queen Street, Ramsgate will be suspended between the junctions with Harbour Street and York Street to allow essential access / exit up to where the road is closed.

ST LUKE'S AVENUE, RAMSGATE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

To allow works to be carried out to provide a new water connection, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of St Luke's Avenue, Ramsgate.

A closure is currently planned from Monday 1 November 2021 for up to 5 days.

St Luke's Avenue will be closed between the junctions with Hardres Road and Denmark Road, to the actual extent shown on site.

The alternative route for through traffic is via Hardres Road, A255 Boundary Road and Denmark Road.

Local access to the remainder of St Luke's Avenue continues from a western direction up to the closure.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

VINCENT ROAD, MARGATE (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

To allow works to be carried out to provide a new water connection, Kent County Council intends to make an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on part of Vincent Road, Margate.

A closure is currently planned from Monday 1 November 2021, with estimated completion by 3 November 2021.

Vincent Road will be closed in the general vicinity of Vincent Cottages, to the actual extent shown on site.

The alternative route for through traffic is via Manston Road, B2050 Manston Road East and Manston Court Road.

Local access to the remainder of Vincent Road continues from either direction up to where the road is closed.

Due to the nature of the works, it will not be possible to re-open the road outside the working hours.

VARIOUS ROADS, MINSTER, THANET (PROHIBITION OF DRIVING) TEMPORARY ORDER 2021

To allow gas mains replacement works to be carried out, Kent County Council has made an Order to temporarily prohibit through traffic on sections of various roads in Minster, near Ramsgate.

Phased closures are planned from Monday 18 October 2021, with estimated completion by 6 December 2021.

FOXBOROUGH LANE, THE LANES, and GRINSELL HILL will be closed in phases to the extent indicated at any time.

Closures are on a rolling basis, working eastwards towards Cottington Road.

Alternative routes will be signposted on site, as follows

- FOXBOROUGH LANE via Tothill Street, High Street, Church Street And Bedlam Court Lane
- THE LANES via Foxborough Lane, Tothill Street, A299 Hengist Way, Cottington Link, Cottington Road and Grinsell Hill
- GRINSELL HILL via The Lanes, Foxborough Lane, Tothill Street, A299 Hengist Way, Cottington Link and Cottington Road

LAUNDRY ROAD, WAY HILL and BEDLAM COURT LANE will be closed at their junctions with Foxborough Lane / The Lanes at certain times as the works progress, with access to the remainder of each road continuing from their alternative junctions.

The closures are in conjunction with temporary traffic lights at certain locations, which may cause some delays at busy times.

Due to the nature of the works, the restrictions will need to remain in force at all times.
