PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION AND DEFINITIVE MAP AND

STATEMENT MODIFICATION ORDER 2022

The above named Order made on 28th April 2022 under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 will divert the entire width of that length of public footpath numbered KH484 which commences at NGR TQ 8698 4822 (Point A on the Order plan) and runs in a south-easterly direction for 143 metres to NGR TQ 8710 4815, and then in an east-north-easterly direction for 95 metres to NGR TQ 8719 4817 and then in a north-north-easterly direction for 28 metres to NGR TQ 8720 4820.

As shown by the bold black line between Points A and B on the Order Plan and will add a new length of public footpath numbered KH484 with a width of 2.0 metres which commences at the aforementioned Point A and runs in a north-easterly direction for 47 metres to NGR TQ 8701 4824, then an easterly direction for 18 metres to NGR TQ 8703 4824 and then in a northerly direction for approximately 15 metres to NGR TQ 8704 4826 (Point C), continuing in an east-south-easterly direction for 76 metres to NGR TQ 8711 4823 (Point D), then in a southerly direction for 21 metres to NGR TQ 8711 4821 and then an east-south-easterly direction for 9 metres to NGR TQ 8712 4820 (Point E) and then in a north-easterly direction for 26 metres to NGR TQ 8714 4821, continuing in an east-south-easterly direction for 63 metres to the aforementioned Point B. As shown by a bold black dashed line between Points A-C-D-E-B on the Order Plan. The northern edge of the path will be 1.0 metre from the field boundary to the north between Points C and D.

All directions general, all distances approximate.

If no such representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Kent County Council may confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is sent to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation any representations and objections which have not been withdrawn will be sent with the Order.
