The above Orders were made on the 4th day of May 2022 under section 119 and Section 118 of the Highways Act 1980 and will (1) Divert: The entire width of that length of Footpath AE464 commencing from a point on the existing driveway situated to the north-west of the property shown on the Order plan as Lydd Cottage (currently known as Beggars Roost) at NGR TR 0541 3602 and running along the driveway to Hungry Hall in a west-south-westerly direction for 84 metres to NGR TR 0533 3598, as shown between the points B and A on the Order Plan. (2) Extinguish: (a) The entire width and length of Public Footpath AE466, commencing from its junction with Public Footpath AE467 at NGR TR 0542 3599 and running for 75 metres in a northerly direction to then follow the western side of the boundary to the property shown on the Order Plan as Lydd Cottage (now known as Beggars Roost) for a further 35 metres to its junction with Public Footpath AE464 at a point adjacent to the property shown on the Order Plan as Lydd Cottage (now known as Beggars Roost), as shown on the Order Plan between the points D and C.

(b) The entire width of that length of Public Footpath AE467 commencing from its junction with Public Footpath AE464 at NGR TR 0538 3601 and running in a south-south-easterly direction for 20 metres to NGR TR0539 3599, as shown between the points A and B on the Order Plan.
